

## **BROKOPP FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP**

(Lancaster Scholarship Foundation, Inc.)



The **Brokopp Family Scholarship** is created by the Brokopp Family members\* who graduated from Lancaster High School and who wish to express their appreciation for the education they received. This scholarship will recognize deserving graduates from Lancaster Senior High School who pursue a two-year or four-year degree in a health-related field or education-related field at the Southwestern Technical College in Fennimore, the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, or the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Secondary consideration will be given to applicants who enroll in health, educational, or scientific fields at other technical colleges or state universities in Wisconsin.

**FUNDING:** The Brokopp Family Scholarship is established in February 2022 with an initial donation of \$10,000. One scholarship of at least \$500 will be awarded annually. Additional donations will increase the size of the annual scholarships.

## **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- 1. Lancaster High School full-time senior who has completed their last two years of high school at Lancaster High School.
- 2. Applicants must be enrolled in a post-secondary educational program of at least two years in length.
- 3. Applicants must complete and submit the application form prior to the announced deadline. The application must include a list of the student's community service activities, work experience, extracurricular activities, leadership positions and honors and awards.
- 4. Submit at least one letter of recommendation from a <u>non-school staff</u> community member who must have known the applicant within the last year and a half.

## SELECTION:

Selection of the scholarship recipient will be made by the Lancaster Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors.

## **PAYMENT:**

The scholarship recipient will receive payment after successfully completing their first semester of schooling and providing proof of <u>full-time</u> enrollment in second semester at an accredited college in Wisconsin. Successful completion of first semester is defined as completing a minimum of 12 credit hours, not being on any type of academic probation status, or being dismissed from school. Proof of extenuating circumstances will be considered on an individual basis by the board.
